Dear Parishioners,

With Summer behind us, things have gotten off to a Pastor great start here. This is truly a beautiful Parish with so many wonderful people who volunteer their time

and talents out of love for God and His Church. A great example of this is the tremendously successful "Pocket Book Bingo" last Friday evening which brought in more than \$17,000 for our Church. The flier in today's bulletin thanks everyone who contributed, but one person not mentioned there, without whom it could not have happen, is our Parish Secretary and Coordinator of Religious Education, Ughette Jilleba. Ughette worked so hard throughout the Summer, as she always does in all things, to put this event together. She gives so much of her time and energy for this parish, and I am so grateful to her. I know it might get tiring to hear of fundraisers all the time, like our Parish Feast Day Raffle which is now underway. But your patience and support are so much needed. Because of this supplemental income to our Sunday Collections, we were able to pay all our bills last year and stay off of Archdiocesan Financial Support for the first time in many years. That is such an important thing for us to maintain, and it cannot happen without you.

Today we look forward to our "Welcome Back Barbeque," which is not a fundraiser, but a wonderful opportunity for our parish family to come together for plenty of food, fun and fellowship. I am so grateful to the Dads of the Father's Club of our School who put so much work into this event, and the Moms of our Home School Association along with other parishioners who volunteer their time in setting up and serving the food and providing desserts. It is a beautiful reminder that we are not two separate entities here, the Church and the School, but we are one Parish Family united in faith and in love, a union that flows from our union with Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass. Although our School is no longer the financial responsibility of our parish, but is under the governance of the East/North East Bronx Region, nothing has changed in terms of our life here. Our school children and their families are an integral and beautiful part of this wonderful Parish, and our Barbeque today is a beautiful expression of that.

How beautiful is our Catholic Church. As I write this letter, Pope Francis is in Washington, D.C., and will soon be here in New York. The tremendous crowds and all the excitement generated by the Pope's visit - from the White House and Congress, to the virtual shutting down of New York City, and to Philadelphia - has to make us stop and think. It is not just Catholics that are flocking to see and hear the Pope, but people of every faith and of no faith at all. What other world leader, what other religious leader attracts so much attention? What is this really all about? People are hungering for God, thirsting for Truth. Even if they cannot articulate it, the human person is searching for God, and the Pope's presence taps in to this yearning that is deep within. Only Jesus can satisfy the desire of every human heart.

As Saint John Paul II put it: "Jesus is the answer to every question that troubles the human heart." What pride we should take in our beautiful Catholic Faith. While so many, whether they know it or not, are searching for Christ, we have Him right in our midst, most especially in the Eucharist. How much we take it for granted. If we Catholics truly lived our faith and cherished it as we should, we would transform our culture and our world. As Saint Catherine of Siena put it: "If we truly were who we are supposed to be, we would set the world on fire." May Pope Francis' visit this week enkindle that fire in the hearts of many, setting our hearts and our world on fire with God's Love. May God bless us all.


