Dear Parishioners,

Pastor had here and will continue to have throughout this What a beautiful and joyful celebration of Easter we glorious Easter Season. It was so encouraging to see the overflowing crowds at Easter Mass, and an extraordinary number of people coming to the Sacrament of Reconciliation the last few weeks of Lent, and especially during Holy Week. And I want to thank you with all my heart for your goodness and generosity to our Parish once again this Easter, and your fidelity all year long.

Last week was such a powerful week, beginning with our Holy Week Mission with Father Glenn Sudano, C.F.R. All who attended got a unique and special gift. A special thank you to our Franciscan Sisters of the Renewal for making this Mission possible and providing such prayerful and beautiful music for all three nights. So many worked so hard to make the Easter Triduum so beautiful. The music, as always, was spectacular thanks to Dale and Joyce Smith and our dedicated choir members consisting of adults, teens, children and members of our Filipino Choir. Thank you to our Lectors who proclaimed the Word of God so powerfully and devoutly, our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, our Ushers, and our dedicated Altar Servers who, as always, did such a splendid job with such care and reverence. I must give special thanks to Ughette Jilleba and Angela Lifrieri who spent so many hours during the week and the entire day Saturday doing all the physical work in preparing the Church for these special and most solemn Liturgies, and the Easter Flowers in the Sanctuary. Now we have six more weeks of this beautiful Easter Season ahead of us until Pentecost to savor the joy of the Resurrection.

Today on this Octave Day of Easter we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. This beautiful devotion to our Lord's Mercy came out of private revelations to a cloister nun in Poland, Sr. Faustina, during the 1920's and 1930's when there were so many manifestations of evil going on in the world, including World War II and the Nazi concentration camps. Everything Jesus revealed to St. Faustina merely reiterates the most fundamental teaching of the Gospel and re-presents it for our times. After many years of investigation by the Church into the authenticity of these private revelations, Saint Pope John Paul II canonized Sister Faustina a Saint in 2000. It was then that Saint John Paul II instituted this Feast of Divine Mercy to be celebrated on the Second Sunday of Easter as a means of imploring us to trust in God's Mercy, to seek God's Mercy especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and then to extend that mercy to others by forgiving one another from the heart just as God has forgiven us. As Jesus said at the end of the Sermon on the Mount: "Be merciful as your Heavenly Father is merciful."

Jesus made these private revelations to Sr. Faustina about the need to turn to Divine Mercy during a time of so much evil and atrocities against human life going on in the world. And today we are seeing evil thrive in our world in the slaughter of human beings and persecution of Christians and other ethnic and religious minorities perpetrated by ISIS and others at a level I have not seen in my lifetime. We need to turn back to God with all our hearts and implore His Mercy "in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world," as we pray in the Divine Mercy Chaplet. As Saint John Paul Il put it, "God has placed a limit on evil in the world: Divine Mercy." Indeed, our Lord revealed to Saint Faustina that: "The world will never find Peace until it turns to my Mercy." Let us do just that with renewed hope in this Easter Season, keeping that beautiful and simple Divine Mercy prayer always in our hearts and on our lips: "Jesus, I trust in You." May God bless us all.






