Dear Parishioners.

Our Parish received great news this week. One of the 12 men ordained to the Priesthood by Cardinal Dolan at St. Patrick's Cathedral last Saturday is being sent to us. Father Matthew Reiman, a brand new priest at only 27 years old, will begin his priesthood here at St. Francis Xavier. What a blessing and honor it is for our Parish. Father Reiman's assignment here as Parochial Vicar begins on June 15th. I look forward to welcoming him and working with him. I know he will be happy here and find in all of us a community of warmth and love, strong in faith.

This is such a great time of here as we are at the threshold of the Summer and so many of our young people are graduating from colleges and universities, high schools, and elementary schools. Our prayers are with all of our young parishioners who have graduated or will be graduating in the coming weeks. We also hold in our hearts and our prayers the young people of our School and Religious Education Program who were sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation this week. We love them and are so proud of them all. May all of our young people stay close to our Lord Jesus and His Church as the beautiful plan He has for their lives unfolds in the years ahead.

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, the Mystery of God in Himself, the source of all life and of love. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in Himself: a communion of persons in relationship - the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit - three distinct Persons, one Divine Nature, one God. Although the mystery of God is beyond our comprehension, many great Saints and Fathers of the Church approached the Mystery of the Trinity by beginning with the words of St. John in one of his New Testament Letters: "God is Love." Love is not just something that God does. Love is the very essence of who God is. Now Love, the argument goes, is not solitary but requires persons in relationship. There is the one who Loves (The Father), the Beloved (The Son), and the Love that is shared between them (The Holy Spirit). So, at the core of all creation, at the very foundation of all life, is a mystery of a relationship of infinite Love between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

This tells not only about who God is, but also who we are and how we are supposed to live. We are made in the image and likeness of God, that is in image and likeness of the Most Holy Trinity. That means each of us is made to reflect the Love of the Trinity, to live in relationship, to live in communion with one another. We are not made to hate anyone but to love one another, we are not made to destroy life but to nurture and cherish life, we are not made to live selfishly but to live selflessly, we are not made to live in conflict with one another but in harmony with one another.

We see this first and foremost in marriage and family life, which Saint Pope John Paul II called an icon of the Trinity. For just as the love freely given and freely received between the Father and the Son is another Person, the Holy Spirit, so too is the love freely given and freely received between a husband and a wife committed in marriage capable of generating another person in their children, creating a Family, an icon of the Most Holy Trinity. How marvelously God made us, and how much happier we are and more beautiful life is when we live according to the way He made us, in the image and likeness of the Most Holy Trinity. May God bless us all.


