Dear Parishioners.

Last weekend we had the joy of celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time with the children of our School and Religious Education

Program preparing for their First Holy Communion in May. What a joy it is to be part of the work of teaching our children our beautiful Catholic Faith, about the Mercy of God, and the boundless love that He has for each and every one of them. The innocence and purity of heart of these precious children remind us of what our hearts should be like. Jesus came to make us new, to give us a new heart, to return us to the innocence and purity we lost by sin. As St. Paul put it in our second reading today: "Whoever is in Christ is a new creation in Christ: old things have passed away; behold, new things have come, and all this is from God, who has reconciled us to Himself through Christ..." That is the cause of our Joy on this Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally called Laetare Sunday, a Latin word which means Rejoice!

The Love of God the Father, who is rich in Mercy, is illustrated so beautifully in today's Gospel of the beloved and rich parable of the *Prodigal Son*. In the dictionary, the word *prodigal* is defined as wastefully extravagant, giving in abundance, lavish and excessive in spending. Indeed the prodigal son squandered and wasted his father's inheritance. He demanded his share of his father's estate that would come to him when his father died, basically saying he wished his father was dead. Taking the money, he squandered it on decadent living until he had nothing and was reduced to eating the food of pigs. Then "coming to his senses" he realizes how good it was to be in his father's house. He decides to go back to his father, but never expecting to be accepted back as his father's son. He only hoped to be taken in as a hired worker so he could at least survive and have food to eat.

Yes, the younger son was prodigal, lavish and excessive in squandering his inheritance. But can we not also say that the Father was prodigal, too, lavish and excessive in Mercy? In justice that son deserved a severe condemnation and punishment. Instead, his Father runs out to embrace him, welcomes him home, restores to him the dignity of being his son, a member of his household, and heir to all that he has. This is what God is like with us as well when we squander His Grace by sin, but then *come to our senses* and repent. As Pope Francis put it, "*The Name of God is Mercy.*" This is what should fill us with so much hope and so much joy on this *Laetare Sunday*.

All this need not remain abstract for us, but is brought home to each one of us in a concrete and most personal way in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. No matter where we have been or what we have done, we always have the opportunity to *come to our senses*, to return to our Father's House, and be welcomed home as His Sons and Daughters in this beautiful Sacrament of Divine Mercy. There are still plenty of opportunities left to get to Confession, especially during Holy Week (See the flier inserted in today's bulletin.) Please do not let Lent go by without making a good Confession. No matter how long it has been, you will be welcomed with great Joy and leave with an inner Peace that the world cannot give or take away. May God bless us all


